

The City of Galt has contacted the County of Sacramento to negotiate property tax exchange agreements for three proposed annexation areas. Currently, the Sloughhouse RCD receives a portion of the ad valorem property tax for the proposed annexation areas, and, upon LAFCo approval of the annexation, the District would no longer receive revenues related to the properties, nor be responsible for providing services.

Comments on these agreements are due to the County of Sacramento by April 23, 2021.

In January 2021, SRCD and the City of Galt signed an MOU committing SRCD to revising our GSA boundary to remove the area annexed by the City once the annexations are completed.


Vicinity Map – Summerfield at Twin Cities



Staff Report on April 14, 2021 Agenda Item #10: South American Subbasin GSP Draft Section 2.3 – Groundwater Conditions

Overview of SASb GSP Draft Section 2.3

.3.1 Groundwater Levels:

- Wells in the western portion of the Subbasin show an overall increase in groundwater levels from 1970 to present.
- Declining trends are seen in the eastern portions of the Subbasin.
 - Not well understood but are largely thought to be attributed to remediation activities at the Inactive Rancho Cordova Test Site, Aerojet, and Kiefer Landfill as well as newer urban groundwater pumping.

.3.2 Groundwater Storage:

- Will be developed once the Water Budget section is complete.
- See Historical and Projected Water Budgets below.

2.3.3 Seawater Intrusion:

 Seawater intrusion is not considered to be an issue in the South American Subbasin due to the distance between the Subbasin and the Pacific Ocean, which is at its closest approximately 30 miles west at San Francisco Bay.

2.3.4 Groundwater Quality:

 Groundwater in the Subbasin is generally of good quality and meets local needs for municipal, domestic, and agricultural uses. Exceedances of constituents may be caused by localized conditions and may not be reflective of regional groundwater quality.

2.3.5 Land Subsidence:

 Minimal occurrence of subsidence in the South American Subbasin. The majority of vertical displacement values in the South American Subbasin are very low to essentially zero, with minimal outliers and with the range of 0.0 to -0.14 ft.




SASb Groundwater Budget Summary – Historical Conditions



Projected INCREASE in groundwater storage under historical conditions: ~2,000 AFY


SASb Groundwater Budget Summary – Projected Conditions
